

Ambassador Pierre ANDRIEU

Former Ambassador of France to the Republic of Moldova and Tadjikistan; former co-chair of the Minsk Group on Nagorno-Karabakh conflict

At the French Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Ambassador Pierre Andrieu started his career in Europe (Bulgaria, Sweden, Finland) and Asia (Nepal). He worked on China, Hong-Kong, and Mongolia in Asia and Oceania Directorate before being appointed as Head of the Western, Nordic and Baltic Europe Department within the European Cooperation Directorate.

He spent five years in Russia, where he was a Political, then Cultural and Cooperation Counsellor. He was committed to Economic diplomacy, as Ambassador for Champagne-Ardenne and Lorraine's regions, and deputy of Mr. Jean-Pierre Chevènement, Special Representative of the government for Russia and former Minister of State.

Pierre Andrieu was Ambassador to Tadjikistan, to Moldova, for the EU Eastern Partnership policy and the Black Sea, and Co-chair of the OSCE Minsk Group to settle the Nagorno-Karabagh conflict. He teaches at Sciences Po Paris (Paris Institute of Political Studies), in INALCO (National Institute of Oriental Languages and Civilizations), and carrying research in International Relations.
