Dr. Bobo Lo is an independent international relations analyst and a Nonresident Fellow at the Lowy Institute. Renowned for his expertise in Russian foreign policy and great power dynamics, he has held several senior positions, including Head of the Russia and Eurasia Programme at Chatham House and Deputy Head of Mission at the Australian Embassy in Moscow.

Dr. Lo is a widely published author, with a body of work that explores the evolving global order and the strategic interplay between major powers. His notable books include *A Wary Embrace: What the China–Russia Relationship Means for the World* (Lowy Institute and Penguin Australia, 2017); *Russia and the New World Disorder* (Brookings and Chatham House, 2015); and *Axis of Convenience: Moscow, Beijing and the New Geopolitics* (Brookings and Chatham House, 2008). His forthcoming book, *The Disorderly Society: Rethinking Global Governance for the 21st Century* (Agenda Publishing), is scheduled for release in September 2025.
