

## **Bogdan Zawadewicz**

Bogdan Zawadewicz is Head of Geopolitical Risk Analysis at the Polish Development Bank (BGK), where he is responsible for assessing strategic international developments with a focus on their implications for economic and financial stability. A graduate of the Institute of Political Sciences at the University of Warsaw, he brings to his role a robust academic and research background in international affairs, with particular expertise in conflict dynamics and geopolitical transformations in Eastern and Southeastern Europe.

Before joining BGK, he held research positions at the Centre for Eastern Studies (OSW) in Warsaw and at the Leibniz Institute for East and Southeast European Studies (IOS) in Regensburg, where he was a member of the research group “Frozen and Unfrozen Conflicts.” His academic development has been shaped by a series of prestigious research fellowships and internships at institutions including the London School of Economics IDEAS, the Higher School of Economics in Moscow, the Center for Southeast European Studies in Graz, the Central European University in Budapest, the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor, and universities in Niš, Novi Sad, and Bucharest. He was also a recipient of a scholarship from the German Academic Exchange Service BAYHOST. In addition to his academic and institutional work, he has contributed as a consultant to the Goethe Institute in Tel Aviv on the project “Negotiations Matter,” which explored the legacy of armed conflict in Bosnia and Herzegovina.
