

**Edina Bećirević**

Co-founder, Atlantic Initiative, Bosnia-Herzegovina

Edina Bećirević is a Professor at the Faculty of Criminal Justice, Criminology and Security Studies at the University of Sarajevo, and a leading scholar in the fields of transitional justice, genocide studies, and extremism. She is also a co-founder of the Atlantic Initiative – Center for Security and Justice Research in Bosnia and Herzegovina, where she has played a central role in advancing policy-relevant research on security and human rights issues in the Western Balkans.

Professor Bećirević has worked as a researcher and consultant for numerous international organizations and has published extensively on topics including genocide, radicalization, and justice in post-conflict societies. Her notable works include *Genocide on the Drina River* (Yale University Press, 2014), *Salafism vs. Moderate Islam* (Atlantic Initiative, 2016), and *Left Behind: Survivors of Violent Extremism* (Atlantic Initiative, 2019), co-authored with her colleagues.

In recent years, her research has increasingly focused on malign foreign influence and reciprocal radicalization. Her analyses and commentaries have been featured in prominent international outlets such as The Intercept, Euronews, and the Institute for War and Peace Reporting.

Professor Bećirević holds degrees from the University of Sarajevo, the London School of Economics and Political Science, and Central European University. She was also a Postdoctoral Fulbright Fellow at Yale University, where she further deepened her research on mass violence and transitional justice.
