A graduate of the London School of Economics, Lucas served for many years as a foreign correspondent, with postings in Berlin, Vienna, Moscow, and the Baltic states. He is widely recognized as an expert on intelligence and espionage, information warfare, energy security, and the strategic manipulation of history.

Lucas is the author of five books, including the international bestseller *The New Cold War* (2008, revised 2014); *Deception* (2011); *The Snowden Operation* (2014); *Cyberphobia* (2015); and *Spycraft Rebooted: How Technology is Changing Espionage* (2018).
