

H.E. Emil Hurezeanu

Minister of Foreign Affairs, Romania

Emil Hurezeanu was appointed Romania's Minister of Foreign Affairs in 2024, following a distinguished career as a diplomat, journalist, writer, and public intellectual. Before taking office as Foreign Minister, he served as Romania's Ambassador to the Federal Republic of Germany from 2015 to 2021 and to Austria from 2021 to 2023.

Hurezeanu began his career in journalism, earning recognition for his work in both Romania and abroad. From 1983 to 1995, he was a Senior Editor and later Director of the Romanian Department at Radio Free Europe in Munich. He then led the Romanian Section of Radio Deutsche Welle in Cologne from 1995 to 2002. Over the years, he has also been an editor and commentator for *România Liberă*, *Cotidianul*, and *Realitatea TV*, and hosted radio and television programs with Europa FM, Money Channel TV, and Digi 24 TV.

His contributions to media and literature have earned him numerous Romanian and international awards for radio and TV journalism, as well as for his published poetry and political essays. Beyond journalism and diplomacy, Hurezeanu has been active in academia. He has lectured at universities across Romania—including Babeş-Bolyai University in Cluj, Alexandru Ioan Cuza University in Iași, and the National College of Defence in Bucharest—as well as internationally at institutions such as Harvard University and the University of Tübingen. He holds honorary doctorates from the University of the West in Timișoara, Lucian Blaga University of Sibiu, Andrei Șaguna University in Constanța, and the Nicolae Bălcescu Land Forces Academy in Sibiu.
