

Matthew Boyse is a Senior Fellow at the Hudson Institute's Center on Europe and Eurasia, where he specializes in Central Europe. He is also an adjunct lecturer at the Johns Hopkins School of Advanced International Studies, George Washington University, and American University.

A former Senior Foreign Service Officer, Mr. Boyse served for over 30 years in the U.S. Department of State, with assignments in Washington, Europe, Canada, and South Asia. His most recent roles included Deputy Assistant Secretary in the Bureau of European and Eurasian Affairs, where he oversaw U.S. policy toward Central Europe and the Office of the Special Envoy for Holocaust Issues, as well as serving as sherpa for the Three Seas Initiative. He also served as Chargé d'Affaires in Switzerland, Finland, Romania, and at the U.S. Mission to NATO.

Earlier, he served as Acting Deputy Chief of Mission and Minister Counselor for Political Affairs in Ottawa, Canada (2015–2018). His postings in Germany included serving as political advisor to three commanding generals of U.S. Army Europe, U.S. Consul General in Düsseldorf, and assignments at the U.S. Embassy in Berlin.

His other overseas assignments include Kabul, New Delhi, Warsaw, Moscow, Dhaka, and London. In Washington, he served as Deputy Director for Political Affairs in the Office of European Union and Regional Affairs, and as Executive Assistant to the Assistant Secretary for Economic and Business Affairs.

Before joining the Foreign Service, Mr. Boyse worked as an East Germany and USSR analyst at Radio Free Europe/Radio Liberty and was a DAAD visiting fellow at the Stiftung Wissenschaft und Politik in Germany.

Mr. Boyse has a BA in classics from Haverford College and an MA in Soviet and East European studies from Columbia University. He speaks German, Polish, and Russian.
